SEAL FUR EARRINGS



History

"Inuit traditional clothing also included personal adornments. Accessories including earrings, necklaces, bracelets, headbands and belts among them. They believed these charms or adornments protected them from danger and helped with the hunt."


materials

Seal fur circles
Backing circle (hide, pig, deer, fur or fabric)
Beads
Beading needle
Thread
Thread protectors
Earring hooks
Glue (white glue or glue stick)



instructions

1. Cut out seal fur and backing material into your desired earring shape. After add a thin layer of white glue between the back of the seal fur and the inside of your backing material to make it extra secure before beading



2. To begin edging, poke your needle out through the backing material. It is the in-between of your front and backing

Note: For further instructions on edging refer to Edge Beading Booklet

- 3. Once you are happy with the finished product and decided where the top of your earring will be, attach your thread protector by bringing your needle and thread through the seal fur then through the last set of edging beads and then the thread protector until it is secured
- 4. Now you can attach your hooks through the thread protector
